



BLINDNESS/LOW VISION SERVICES

Eligibility:

Individuals aged 55 or older whose vision loss has impacted activities of daily living and live in Orange County.

Individuals ages 18 to 54 who experience vision loss. Individuals cannot be a client of the Department of Rehabilitation, employed or seeking employment.

Service Delivery:

Services are customized to each person's needs and provided at home, DMC, or remotely.

Cost:

All services are provided free of charge and are funded through a grant from the California Department of Rehabilitation.



Independent Living & Adjustment

Instruction in adaptive techniques for personal care, housekeeping tasks, cooking, and money management

Assistive Technology Devices & Training

Provision and training in the use of devices such as talking clocks, talking blood pressure monitors and more.

Orientation and Mobility

Training in human guide technique, provision of a white cane, ID cane or white support cane and referral to limited orientation and mobility training options.

Communication Assistance

Adaptive methods of handwriting/typing; use of communication devices such as digital recorders, smart phones, and computers with speech software

Self-Advocacy

Strategies for decision-making, problem-solving, and assessment of possible risks and consequences

Peer support

Occurs through the hosting of low vision peer support groups. Peer support occurs through the process of bringing consumers together to discuss vision loss related topics.

Information and Referral

Provision of referrals/resources, and/or information to another program/organization such as the National Library Services, US Currency Reader Program.

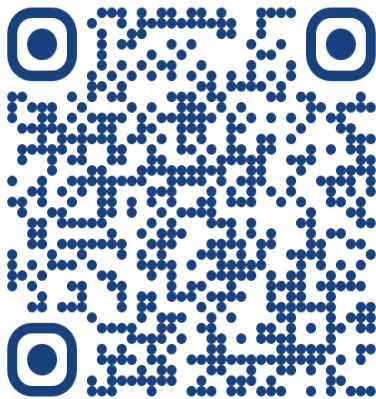
Our services aim to provide individuals who have vision loss with the knowledge and tools to live independently while remaining in their own homes.
