



DMC Housing Resource List 2025

For unhoused individuals, please connect with the following organizations based on the city you are located in and request to be entered into the **Coordinated Entry System (CES)** to be matched to a housing program. CES housing options include: shelters, domestic violence shelters, transitional housing, Rapid ReHousing support (RRH), and permanent housing programs.

CES has implemented a Shelter Bed Reservation System for individuals (adult-only households) and families (households with minor children) as a centralized system where available shelter beds can be accessed by individuals and families experiencing homelessness.
